MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING

January 16, 2020

The Weatherford College Board of Trustees met in regular session at 2:00 p.m., Thursday, January 16, 2020 in the Allene Strain Community Room of the Doss Student Center. Chairman Mac Smith called the meeting to order. Other Trustees present were Vice-Chair Sue Coody, Secretary Lela Morris, Dr. Robert Marlett, and Dr. Trev Dixon. Elaine Carter and Judy McAnally were absent. Brent Baker, Vice President of Institutional Advancement, gave the invocation, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Call to Order, Invocation, and Pledge of Allegiance

No one spoke in open forum.

Open Forum

President Tod Allen Farmer gave the following recognitions, employee notices, and an enrollment report:

President's Report

a. Recognitions:

- Hayden Harbold, Jessica McKee, Ashleigh Thompson and the Workforce Education team for their outstanding contributions to implement Corporate College at WC. At the December 2019 National Council for Continuing Education and Training Conference in Florida, the WC Corporate College Program was presented the inaugural Exemplary Program Award. This honor is in recognition of outstanding results and contributions for new curriculum development in the areas of workforce education. As honorees, Jessica McKee and Ashleigh Thompson, presented at the conference on the development of Corporate College for the sustainability and replicability for other public and private colleges and universities.
- All who helped make the dream of a BSN program a reality: Officials at the Texas Higher Educating Coordinating Board have approved Weatherford College to begin offering bachelor's degrees in the Fall 2020 semester.
- The annual Employee Awards Banquet was a huge success last month. Kay Landrum was named staff member of the year, Shantee Siebuhr was named staff member on the rise, Nick Pugh was named faculty member on the rise, and Rhonda Torres was honored with a Presidential Core Values Coin.

- Beverly Gibbs and team recently led an Academic Support Center effort resulting in the College Reading & Learning Associations International Tutor Training Program Certification.
- Weatherford College athletic teams continue to excel: The Lady Coyotes are 14-2, the Coyotes are 13-5, and our rodeo team is having another great year. Additionally, seven of our rodeo athletes ended the fall semester with a perfect 4.0 GPA. Our Coyotes are excelling both in the classroom and on the competition surfaces.

b. Employment Notices -

c. Enrollment Update -

Enrollment management techniques have slowed growth until the college can catch up on parking and classroom availability. As of the second day of classes of the Spring 2020 semester, 5,533 students were enrolled, slightly down from recent record high enrollment numbers. By employing enrollment management techniques ad enforcing existing policies, such as small section cancellation and late registration deadlines, we have slightly limited enrollment growth while improving our overall financial position.

The cash balance as of December 31, 2019 is \$35,771,499.94. This is an increase of \$18,284.61 from last year at December 31, 2018. The operating statement at December 31, 2019 indicates that total revenues collected are \$28,199,898 or 51.66% of budget. Total expenditures are \$22,530,763 or 41.29% of budget. Financial Reports

EA (Local) Policy requires Board approval of the Academic Calendar. As necessary, the Board may amend the calendar. Mr. Finley, Executive Dean of Student Services, submitted and recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the 2020-21 Academic Calendar. 2020-21 Academic Calendar is attached.

2020-2021 Academic Year And Calendar

The 2019-20 budget amendment #1 is attached for the review and approval by the Board of Trustees. The budget amendment includes: (1) the transfer from reserves for the year-end bonuses; (2) the reallocation of salary savings to offset the tuition shortfall for Fall; (3) the reallocation of funds for instructional staff development; (4) the contribution from the Foundation to the College for the Steinway pianos as well as the receipt by the College of insurance proceeds for a water damaged piano; and (5) the receipt of Talent Search grant carryover funds and supplemental STEM grant funds. Dr. Cantrell recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the 2019-20 budget amendment #1 as presented in the attached summary. Attached is the Memorandum from Andra Cantrell to Dr. Tod Allen Farmer summarizing the 2019-20 budget amendment #1.

2019-20 Budget Amendment #1

A total of three (3) vendors submitted a competitive sealed bid for the requested Workforce Education Semi-Tractor Truck. MHC Kenworth – Dallas, MHC Kenworth - Fort Worth, and Southwest International Truck have all provided bids that meet our specifications. Terry Pilgrim, Director of Workforce Education Truck Driving Academy, has recommended award to Southwest International Truck for the 2018 Kenworth T680 Aerodyne as the truck that provides the best value on truck requested. This recommendation was based on comments from a semi-truck service technician who stated that the 2016 models have issues with carbon packing in the cylinders and a ceramic plunger in the fuel injector pump that could cause major engine damage. Funds have been allocated in the current 2019-2020 budget for purchase of the truck. After evaluation and review of the sealed bids, Terry Pilgrim, Director of Workforce Education Truck Driving Academy, Jeanie Hobbs, Director of Purchasing, and Toni Martin, Assistant Director of Purchasing recommended award of this sealed bid not to exceed budget funds as follows: Southwest International Truck, \$67,950.00. Ms. Morris made the motion to approve the Consent Agenda as presented. Ms. Coody seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Consent Agenda 757-1 Approved As required by the Texas Government Code 2258.022(a), the Board of Trustees, when contracting for a public work awarded by a political subdivision of the state, shall determine the general prevailing rate of per diem wages in the locality in which the public work is to be performed for each craft or type of worker needed to execute the contract and the prevailing rate for legal holiday and overtime work. Subsection (1) and (2) go on to state the public body's options in fulfilling its statutory responsibility of determining prevailing wage rates as being: 1) Conducting a survey of the wages received by classes of workers employed on projects of a character similar to the contract work in the political subdivision of the state in which the public work is to be performed; or 2) Using the prevailing wage rate as determined by the United States Department of Labor in accordance with the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. Section 276a et seq.), and its subsequent amendments. Mr. Rawley McCoy, President of Rawley McCoy & Associates and Consultant to Weatherford College made the recommendation that the Board of Trustees approve Texas Government Code Section 2258.022(a), Subsection (2) as its option in determining the general prevailing wage rate of per diem wages as presented. Dr. Marlett made the motion to approve Mr. McCoy's recommendation as presented, Ms. Coody seconded and the motion carried unanimously. SUBJECT: Financial Reports Ending January 31, 2020

INFORMATION AND DISCUSSION: The cash balance as of January 31, 2020 is \$46,351,315.12. This is an increase of \$793,308.90 from last year at January 31, 2019. The operating statement at January 31, 2020 indicates that total revenues collected are \$39,823,572 or 72.52% of budget. Total expenditures are \$26,588,176 or 48.43% of budget.

INFORMATION AND DISCUSSION:

Several members of the college community have expressed a desire to memorialize former agriculture instructor and rodeo coach Mike Brown on our Weatherford campus. The President's Cabinet suggests naming the north wing of the first floor of the Academic Building the "Mike Brown Wing." This area now includes agriculture classes as well as displays celebrating agriculture and rodeo. This action would be in line with the board's two year waiting period for "tribute namings" in the college's naming/facilities planning policy (CL Local).

In addition, the Cabinet recommends renaming the Agriculture Building the "Police and Maintenance Building." Agriculture is no longer housed in this building, as the WC Police Department has moved into that space.

As an additional piece of information for the board, the college will now begin referring to the Jim and Veleda Boyd Technology Building as simply the Jim and Veleda Boyd Building or "Boyd Building" for short. The building's uses have expanded beyond technology since the board named the facility approximately 20 years ago.

RECOMMENDATION:

We recommend that the board name the north wing of the first floor of the Academic Building the "Mike Brown Wing" and the former Agriculture Building the "Police and Maintenance Building."

SUBJECT: 2020-21 Tuition and Fees

INFORMATION AND DISCUSSION: Based upon the recommendation of the Tuition and Fees Advisory Committee, the administration is considering changes in tuition and fees for the 2020-21 academic year. The administration, along with the assistance of the Tuition and Fees Advisory Committee, have researched and analyzed the current rates of Weatherford College and the other community colleges in the state of Texas. Factors reviewed during the analysis were:

- Anticipated budget expenditures for the 2020-21 budget including increases in faculty and staff.
- 2020-21 state appropriations.
- Tuition and fee revenue supplements and other major revenue sources, primarily property taxes.

Changes in tuition and fees recommended by the Tuition and Fees Advisory Committee are listed below for the 2020-21 academic year:

- Tuition rates for in-district students would increase by \$6.00 per semester credit hour or 7%. Tuition for out-of-district students would increase by \$13.00 per semester credit hour or 9%. Tuition for out-of-district WCWC students would increase by \$9.00 per semester credit hour or 8%. Tuition for out-of-district ECG students would increase by \$12.00 per semester credit hour or 9%. Out-of-state rates would increase by \$18.00 per semester credit hour or 9%.
- The differential tuition rate for the Associate Degree Nursing program would increase by \$20.00 to \$80.00.
- An RN-to-BSN program differential tuition rate of \$80.00 would be added to match the ADN program differential tuition rate.
- Room and Board charges will increase by \$50.00 per semester for both 10-meal and 19-meal plans.
- Due to the conversion to the Colleague system, we will not be able to continue with our current payment plan provider—Nelnet. In the past, Nelnet handled all payment plans and charged our students the \$25.00 payment plan application fee. We have opted to

- handle the payment plans in-house through TouchNet, and by doing so we will charge and collect the \$25.00 application fee from the student.
- Parking permits for the summer semester would be simplified by increasing the fee to \$30.00 for the entire summer term instead of a separate \$20.00 fee for each summer semester.

A final recommendation will be made to the Board of Trustees in March after further consideration and review of the preliminary budget. The review of other community college's proposed rates is also ongoing.
