The Weatherford College Board of Trustees met in regular session at 2:00 p.m., Thursday, August 12, 2021 in the Allene Strain Community Room of the Doss Student Center. Board Chair Mac Smith called the meeting to order. Other trustees present were Dan Carney, Vice Chair Sue Coody, Doug Dowd, Dr. Trev Dixon, Dr. Robert Marlett, Judy McAnally and Lela Morris were absent. Brent Baker, Vice President of Institutional Advancement, gave the invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Call to Order, Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance

President Tod Allen Farmer submitted the following recognitions and employee notices in advance of the meeting:

President's Report

a. Recognitions -

- Congratulations to the inaugural graduating class of the Weatherford College Bachelor of Science in Nursing program. Eleven students will be graduating this Friday night.
- Weatherford College Athletics is reaching new heights.
 The same discipline that leads to success on the competition surfaces leads to success in the classroom.
 Twenty-one Weatherford College athletes were recently named to the 2020-2021 All-Academic Teams by the National Junior College Athletic Association for achieving a GPA above 3.6. The WC baseball and softball teams also received team recognitions for their overall academic success.
- Former Coyote Softball pitcher, Morgan Rackel, who recently won an Olympic bronze metal as a member of the Canadian National Team. Morgan became the fourth former Coyote to participate in the Olympics.
- Two former Coyote baseball players who were recently drafted into Major League Baseball: Carlos Tavera was drafted by the Baltimore Orioles and Brenden Dixon was drafted by the Pittsburg Pirates. Thirty-four former Coyote baseball players have been drafted into professional baseball.

The 2020-21 budget amendment #3 is attached for review and approval by the Board of Trustees. A budget amendment is necessary to transfer funds out of unrestricted reserves for the baseball field turf project to cover the portion of the project that was not raised through donations. The Board previously gave authorization to transfer unrestricted reserve funds at the May 13, 2021 Board meeting. The recommendation was that the Board of Trustees approves budget amendment #3 as presented in the attached summary. Budget Amendment #3

The Board of Trustees is asked to consider granting authorization to proceed with a proposal for a new Associate of Applied Science Degree and Certificate Program in Audio Engineering to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) and Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS). The proposed new program has already begun to offer test courses. The new program will allow the institution to expand its workforce education offerings while taking better advantage of some of the recording capabilities presented by the acquisition of the Bob and Nan Kingsley Building. It was recommended that that the Board of Trustees approve the authorization to proceed with the proposal of the New Associate of Applied Science Degree and Certificate Program in Audio Engineering to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) and Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS). Weatherford College is currently completing Renewal #2 of a possible four-year contract with Ben E. Keith Foods DFW and Sysco North Texas for Food Service Products & Supplies for the Weatherford College Cafeteria. The initial contract began September 14, 2018 and ended on August 31, 2019, with an option for three additional one-year term renewals. To comply with state law requirements for bids or proposals on all products and services of \$50,000 or more to be approved by the Board of Trustees, Erin Davidson, Food Service Director, Deborah Terrell, Senior Buyer, and Jeanie Hobbs, Director of Purchasing are requesting approval of the third renewal term on our contract for Food Service Products & Supplies from the two current awarded vendors: Ben E. Keith Foods DFW and Sysco North Texas, as allowed by law. Total costs for the initial and current year of the contract are below.

The proposed renewal year costs will be no more than a 2% increase on the items unit price due to the unstable markets in some food categories, rising food prices, tariffs, and food trucking costs, as agreed upon by all parties. All

vendors agree to continue to meet our specifications and provide the best value on the food and equipment requested by Weatherford College. Additional items may be added at a later date during this contract when needed. Purchase of food and equipment is based solely on availability of current funds and actual requirements. Any or all items awarded as a result of the sealed bid process may not be purchased if budgeted funds are not available. Attached is the Tabulation on Food Service Products & Supplies #SB-03-19 submitted by Dr. Andra R. Cantrell, Executive Vice-President of Financial & Administrative Affairs.

Weatherford College has currently completed the second-year renewal of a possible five-year contract with Lone Star Coaches, Game Time Transportation/TUI Bus Service and Cowtown Bus Charters for commercial chartered bus services. The initial contract began June 18, 2018 and ended on June 30, 2019, with an option for four additional one-year term renewals. To comply with state law requirements for bids or proposals for all services of \$50,000.00 or more to be approved by the Board of Trustees, the Team Athletic Director, Mr. Bob McKinley is requesting approval of the third renewal term of contract for Commercial Charter Bus Services from the current awarded vendors: Lone Star Coaches, Game Time Transportation/TUI Bus Service and Cowtown Bus Charters, as allowed by law. Total costs for the third-year renewal of contract are as follows: Lone Star Coaches at \$49,627.91, Game Time Transportation at \$26,822.73, Cowtown Bus Charters at \$0.00 for a total estimated cost of \$76,450.64. The proposed rates will remain the same as last year's rates for Cowtown Bus Charters and Lone Star Coaches; however, rates were increased by 3% by Game Time Transportation, as agreed upon by all parties. All vendors agree to continue to meet our specifications and provide the best value on the athletic trips requested by baseball, basketball (both men and women), and softball; as well as any trips requested by WC Clubs and the TRIO programs. Additional trips will be added at a later date during this contract when needed. Purchase of awarded trips is based solely on availability of current funds and actual requirements. Any or all trips awarded as a result of the proposal process may not be purchased if budgeted funds are not available. Weatherford College is currently completing the initial three year contract of a possible six-year contract with Smith Lawn & Tree and TLC Landscaping & Irrigation for grounds maintenance and landscaping services. The initial contract began August 9, 2018 and will end on August 31, 2021, with an option for one additional three-year term renewal. To comply with state law requirements for bids or proposals for all services of \$50,000.00 or more to be approved by the Board of Trustees, the Weatherford College Wise County Facilities Manager, Mr. Tony Hurtt and Weatherford College – CBRE Facilities Manager, Mrs. Rhonda Swan are requesting approval of the final renewal term of contract for Grounds Maintenance and Landscaping Services from the

Final Renewal of Grounds Maintenance and Landscaping #RFP-01-19 current awarded vendors: Smith Lawn & Tree and TLC Landscaping & Irrigation, as allowed by law. Total annual costs for the final renewal of contract are: Smith Lawn & Tree (WC Main) with an Annual Cost of \$48,976.50 and a Total Estimated Three Year Cost of \$48,976.5; TLC Landscaping & Irrigation (WCWC) with an Annual Cost of \$49,979.04 and a Total Estimated Three Year Cost of \$149,937.12 for a total estimated annual and three year contract of \$66,304.54 and \$198,913.62. The proposed rates were increased by 3% by both companies, as agreed upon by all parties. All vendors agree to continue to meet our specifications and provide the best value on the grounds maintenance and landscaping services requested by Weatherford College. Purchase of awarded services are based solely on availability of current funds and actual requirements. Any services awarded as a result of the proposal process may not be purchased if budgeted funds are not available. A total of three (3) vendors submitted competitive sealed bids for the requested Color and Web Printing for 2021-2022. Comark Direct; Four Color Press and Hartness Print Central have all provided bids that meet our specifications and offer the best value on items requested. Funds have been requested in the 2021-2022 budget for purchase of these products. After evaluation and review of the sealed bids, Katie Edwards, Director of Creative Services, Jeanie Hobbs, Director of Purchasing, and Toni Martin, Assistant Director of Purchasing recommend award of this sealed bid not to exceed budget funds as follows: Comark Direct at \$43,622.00, Four Color Press at \$998.70 and Hartness Print Central at \$18,296.04 for a total estimated cost of \$62,916.74. The 2021-22 Proposed Budget was presented to the Board of Trustees on August 12, 2021. At that time revenues and expenditures totaled \$77,744,313. No changes have been made to revenues and expenditures since that time, leaving the final proposed budget unchanged at \$77,744,313. Ms. Morris made the motion to approve the proposed 2021-22 budget in the amount of \$77,744,313, the salary structure schedules for the 2021-22 fiscal year, and the employment of the contractual employees included in the proposed 2021-22 budget. Ms. Coody seconded and the motion carried unanimously. Dr. Andra R. Cantrell, Executive Vice President for Financial and Administrative Affairs, presented, as proposed on August 12, 2021, the recommended tax rate of \$0.122476 per \$100 assessed valuation for the 2021 tax year. This rate includes the maintenance and operations rate of \$0.119032 and the debt service rate of \$0.003444. Based upon the certified appraisal roll of \$17,923,681,369 the 2021 rate of \$0.122476 is estimated to generate \$20,281,707 in maintenance and operations tax revenue and the required \$597,400 necessary to fund debt service for the 2021-22 fiscal year. The proposal was made to adopt the 2021 ad valorem tax rate of \$0.122476 (\$0.119032 for maintenance and operations plus \$0.003444 for debt service) by also adopting the Tax Ordinance Fixing and Levying Ad Valorem Taxes for the Weatherford College District for the Year of 2021 and for each year thereafter until otherwise provided. Ms. Coody seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

SUBJECT: Smart Classrooms with Zoom Communication Capabilities

INFORMATION AND DISCUSSION: Section 3 of the Board approved 2021-2026 Weatherford College Strategic Plan contains the Technology Master Plan which describes an initiative to "provide consistent, modern and reliable classroom technology for instructors to use. Ensure that every classroom has an inventory of equipment that falls into one of the three newest generations of classroom equipment configurations". While the smart-classrooms designed for the new Emerging Technology and Workforce Building provide technology enabled enhancements to current Weatherford College classroom design, adding capabilities for hybrid classrooms utilizing Zoom communication capabilities and/or other online audio/visual features would position Weatherford College with adaptive capabilities to more easily respond to the ever-evolving current and post-pandemic educational needs.

on Electronic Access Controls and Security Cameras

INFORMATION AND DISCUSSION: Electronic Access and Security Cameras are included in the approved design documents for the new Emerging Technology and Workforce Building currently under construction on the Weatherford College main campus. In 2021, electronic access control was installed in the Weatherford College Kingsley Building which included door access management software (Lenell S2). The door access management system was installed with the expectation that it would be expanded for utilization as additional Weatherford College buildings were built and/or renovated to include electronic access control. Advanced Connection, Inc. (ACI) currently provides all support and maintenance of the Lenell S2 security system management software. In addition, Advanced Connections, Inc (ACI) has been utilized for the most recent camera installations on the main campus, including the Kingsley Building, Baseball, and Softball fields. Cameras installed in these locations are currently under warranty by ACI, meaning if the camera fails ACI works with the manufacture to repair and/or replace the camera.

To reduce the risk associated with multiple vendors installing cabling in the same cable pathways, Imperial Construction recommended utilizing the same vendor they have under contract for network cabling. Utilizing the same vendor allows a single source provider to pull all cables simultaneously. Working under a separate contract with Imperial Construction, Inc., ACI is the vendor providing network cabling services for the Emerging Technology and Workforce Building.

To comply with requirements for all products and services of \$50,000.00 or more to be approved by the Board of Trustees and after evaluation and review, Dr. Priscilla Parsons, Executive Director of Technology Services, Mrs. Toni Martin, Assistant Director of Purchasing, and Mrs. Jeanie Hobbs, Director of Purchasing, recommend approval of this purchase under the existing Tips-USA Contract for the total cost of \$151,310.00. The Tips-USA contract proposal from Advanced Connections Inc. (ACI) itemizing details for the products and services is attached.

Johnson Controls Incorporated is pleased to provide you with a proposal to replace HVAC equipment for the campus buildings listed below. We have surveyed each building and reviewed with our in-house engineer for proper application, selection, and installation of the HVAC equipment.

We have addressed the building high humidity levels by engineering the units with variable speed indoor fan, staged cooling, hot gas reheat, and control to improve student and staff comfort. This is a similar dehumidification solution that we provided for Fine Arts. To meet IAQ (Indoor Air Quality) standards the HVAC Units are selected with MERV 8 air filtration and enthalpy controlled outside air economizers.

The return air for the LART building is an open return ducting system. The return air is pulled through the drop ceiling and fed into a concrete tunnel that is leaching moisture (humidity) into the return air stream. The three (3) existing HVAC units appear to be performing well, but cannot handle the high humidity.

We are recommending the following steps be taken to correct and resolve the high humidity issues:

- Installation of lined return air ductwork from the LART office space through the tunnel and directly connected to the Air Handlers.
- Reconfiguration of the Air Handlers to accommodate the return air ductwork.
- Service and cleaning of the Air Handler evaporator coils.

References to "products" or "equipment" herein shall mean the product and equipment to be furnished by Seller as identified on the applicable Seller Quotation. These Standard Terms and Conditions may be modified or rescinded only by a writing signed by authorized representatives of both Seller and Buyer.
- (2) **TERMINATION OR MODIFICATION**. Accepted orders may by cancelled or modified by Buyer only with Seller's express written consent. If cancellation or modification is allowed, Buyer agrees to pay to Seller all expenses incurred and damage sustained by Seller on account of such cancellation or modification, plus a reasonable profit.
- (3) PRICE, SHIPMENT, AND PAYMENT. Prices on accepted orders are firm for a period of 90 days from date of acceptance. This warranty does not cover failures caused in whole or in part by (i) improper installation or maintenance performed by anyone other than Seller; (iii) improper use or application; (iii) corrosion; (iv) normal deterioration; (v) operation beyond rated capacity, (vi) the use of replacement parts or lubricants which do not meet or exceed Seller's specifications, or (vii) if Seller's serial numbers or warranty date decals have been removed or altered. To qualify for warranty consideration for products or equipment, at the earlier of the Buyer's discovery of the defect or the time at which the Buyer should have discovered the defect; Buyer must immediately notify Seller in writing for instructions on warranty procedures. Seller's sole obligation for defective services shall be to repair or to replace defective parts or to properly redo defective services. All replaced equipment becomes Seller's property. THIS WARRANTY IS EXCLUSIVE AND IN LIEU OF ALL OTHER EXPRESS OR IMPLIED WARRANTIES INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION ANY WARRANTY OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE.

 WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THOSE OF MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE.
- (7) INDEMNIFICATION, REMEDIES AND LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY. In addition to Paragraph 8 below regarding patents, Buyer agrees that Seller shall be responsible only for such injury, loss, or damage caused by the intentional misconduct or the negligent act or omission of Seller. In the event Buyer claims Seller has breached any of its obligations under the Agreement, whether of warranty or otherwise, Seller may request the return of the goods and tender to Buyer the purchase price theretofore paid by Buyer, and in such event, Seller shall have no further obligation under the Agreement except to refund such purchase price upon redelivery of the goods. If Seller so requests the return of the goods, the goods shall be redelivered to Seller in accordance with Seller's instructions and at Seller's expense. The remedies contained in these Standard Terms and Conditions shall constitute the sole recourse of Buyer against Seller for breach of any of Seller's obligations under the Agreement, whether of warranty or otherwise. In no event shall Seller be liable for special, indirect, incidental, or consequential damages, including loss of anticipated profit, or other economic loss, or for any damages arising in tort whether by reason of strict liability, negligence, or otherwise regardless of whether it has been apprised of the possibility of such.
- (8) PATENTS. Seller shall indemnify, defend or at its option settle, and hold Buyer and its directors, officers, employees, agents, subsidiaries, affiliates, subcontractors and assignees, harmless from and against any and all claims, suits, actions or proceeds ("Claims") against such parties based upon the infringement or alleged infringement, or violation or alleged violation, of (a) any United States patent and (b) any copyright, trademark, trade secret or other proprietary right of a third party which is enforceable in the United States, as a result of Buyer's use of the product or equipment within the United States, provided that: (i) Buyer gives Seller prompt written notice of any such Claim, (ii) Buyer gives Seller full authority to defend or settle any such Claim, and (iii) Buyer gives Seller proper and full information and assistance, at Seller's expense (except for Buyer's employees' time) to defend or settle any such Claim. THE FOREGOING IS IN LIEU OF ANY WARRANTIES OF NONINFRINGEMENT, WHICH ARE HEREBY DISCLAIMED. The foregoing obligation of Seller does not apply with respect to products or equipment or portions or components thereof (a) not supplied by Seller, (b) made in whole or in part in accordance to Buyer or owner specifications, (c) which are modified after shipment by Seller, if the alleged infringement related to such modification, (d) combined with other products, processes or materials where the alleged infringement relates to such combination, (e) where Buyer continues allegedly infringing activity after being notified thereof and/or after being informed of modifications that would have avoided the alleged infringement without significant loss of performance or functionality, or (f) where Buyer's use of the product or equipment is incident to an infringement not resulting primarily from the product or equipment; Buyer will indemnify Seller and its officers, agents, and employees from all damages.

Settlements, attorneys' fees and expenses related to a claim of infringement, misappropriation, defamation, violation of rights of publicity or privacy excluded from Seller's indemnity obligation herein.

- (9) GOVERNING LAW. The formation and performance of the Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Wisconsin, U.S.A. Any action for breach of the Agreement or any covenant or warranty must be commenced within one year after the cause of action has accrued unless such provision is not permitted by applicable law.
- (10) DISPUTE RESOLUTION. Seller shall have the sole and exclusive right to determine whether any dispute, controversy or claim arising out of or relating to this Agreement, or the breach thereof, shall be submitted to a court of law or arbitrated. The venue for any such arbitration shall be in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. The arbitrator's award may be confirmed and reduced to judgment in any court of competent jurisdiction. In the event the matter is submitted to a court, Seller and Buyer hereby agree to waive their right to trial by jury and covenant that neither of them will request trial by jury in any such litigation.
- (11) SOFTWARE LICENSE. To the extent software is provided by Seller under this Agreement, Buyer agrees that such software may only be used in accordance with the terms and conditions of the software license agreement that accompanies the software. Buyer agrees not to directly or indirectly decompile, disassemble, reverse engineer or otherwise derive the source code for the software. If Buyer is a U.S. Government agency, Buyer acknowledges that the software licensed under this agreement is a commercial item that has been developed at private expense and not under a Government contract. The Government's rights relating to the software are limited to those rights applicable to Buyer's as set forth herein and is binding on Government users in accordance with Federal Acquisition Regulation 48 C.F.R. Section 12.212 for non-defense agencies and/or Defense FAR Supplement 48 C.F.R. Section 227.7202-1 for defense agencies.

(12) MISCELLEANEOUS

- (a) CHANGES OF CONSTRUCTION AND DESIGN: Seller reserves the right to change or revise the construction and design of the products or equipment purchased by Buyer, without liability or obligation to incorporate such changes to products or equipment ordered by Buyer unless specifically agreed upon in writing reasonably in advance of the delivery date for such products or equipment. Buyer agrees to bear the expense of meeting any changes or modifications in local code requirements which become effective after Seller has accepted Buyer's order.
- (b) CHARACTER OF PRODUCT AND SECURITY INTEREST: The goods delivered by Seller under the terms of the Agreement shall remain personal property and retain its character as such no matter in what manner affixed or attached to any structure or property. Buyer grants Seller a security interest in said goods, any replacement parts and any proceeds thereof until all sums due Seller have been paid to it in cash. This security interest shall secure all indebtedness or obligations of whatsoever nature now or hereafter owing Buyer to Seller. Buyer shall pay all expenses of any nature whatsoever incurred by Seller in connection with said security interest.
- (c) **INSURANCÉ**: Buyer agrees to insure the goods delivered under the Agreement in an amount at least equal to the purchase price against loss or damage from fire, wind, water or other causes. The insurance policies are to be made payable to Seller and Buyer in accordance with their respective interests, and when issued are to be delivered to Seller and held by it. Failure to take out and maintain such insurance shall entitle Seller to declare the entire purchase price to be immediately due and payable and shall also entitle Seller to recover possession of said goods.
- (d) INSTALLATION: If installation by the Seller is included within the Seller's Quotation, Buyer shall provide all of the following at its own expense and at all times pertinent to the installation: i) free, dry, and reasonable access to Buyer's premises; and ii) proper foundations, lighting, power, water and storage facilities reasonably required.
- (e) Compliance with Laws: Seller's obligations are subject to the export administration and control laws and regulations of the United States. Buyer shall comply fully with such laws and regulation in the export, resale or disposition of purchased products or equipment. Quotations or proposals made, and any orders accepted by Seller from a Buyer outside the United States are with the understanding that the ultimate destination of the products or equipment is the country indicated therein. Diversion of the products or equipment to any other destination contrary to the United States is prohibited. Accordingly, if the foregoing understanding is incorrect, or if Buyer intends to divert the products or equipment to any other destination, Buyer shall immediately inform Seller of the correct ultimate destination.

Pathways:

Weatherford College Honors: The faculty leaders of the Honors Program, PTK, and NSLS are collaborating to serve our high-performing students as they pursue their educational goals. The Honors Program, under the direction of Ms. Michelle Burt, has # students enrolled at this time. PTK and NSLS are accepting new members. Ms. Cheryl Stanton and Ms. Sharon Johnson will assume advisor responsibilities for PTK. Dr. Bishnu Twanabasu and Dr. Laura McBride will serve as faculty advisors for NSLS.

WC/MSU Articulation Plans: WC staff members are collaborating with peers at Midwestern State University to create articulation plans in several workforce and transfer-intended programs. These include Respiratory Care, Radiological Technology, Nursing, Psychology, General Business, Accounting, and Social Work. The programs included cover a majority of those majors identified by our students seeking baccalaureate degrees.

Audio Technology & Mass Communications: The College's revitalized Mass Communications Program will be assigned to the Fine Arts Department, along with the new Audio Technology Program. Together, these programs will provide students with various avenues to acquire skills and knowledge vital to success in the broadcast and recording industries. The proposal for the workforce Audio Technology Program is currently under review with the THECB. It has begun offering courses in anticipation of THECB approval. The Mass Communication Program does not require THECB approval. It will begin offering courses this spring.

Numbers With Heart:

9/1/2021 - Weatherford College received staff level authorization to offer the Bachelor's of Applied Technology in Medical and Health Services Management Degree.

What is the Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP)?

Required as part of the ten year SACSCOC reaffirmation process, a QEP is a five-year plan that arises from a college's institutional planning process, and is focused on improving student learning and/or student success. As part of the 2022 Reaffirmation of Accreditation, WC has engaged in an intensive process to develop a QEP that will engage students with resources they need to be successful in navigating their college career. It is important that faculty, staff, and students be familiar with the plan to ensure success. This handout is an overview of Weatherford College's QEP, Resources Open Opportunities to Students (ROOTS).

How was the ROOTS topic selected?

In Fall 2019, Weatherford College formed a QEP Topic Selection Committee to identify our college's next QEP topic. Using institutional data, Board of Trustees, faculty and staff focus groups, and student surveys the committee identified enhancing the success of students through an umbrella of resources as the QEP broad topic.

What will Students Learn from the ROOTS QEP?

Student Success Outcome 1:

Students will select a Guided Pathway in the ROOTS Canvas classroom prior to the first face-to-face meeting with an advisor and explore the Career Readiness Toolkit for achieving success based on their awareness of personal interests, aptitudes, and abilities.

Student Success Outcome 2:

Students will become aware of campus resources by completing ROOTS Canvas classroom activities that explore required orientation, advisors, instructional support, faculty mentors, student clubs and organizations.

Student Success Outcome 3:

Students will identify marketable skills that correspond with the core curriculum objectives of Communication, Personal Responsibility, and Critical Thinking through mandatory orientation and completion of aligned activities for each skill set.

What is the Intended Outcome of the ROOTS QEP?

The QEP will increase student retention and completion, while decreasing excess hours earned, and guide students in completing their degree on time.

When does implementation of the five-year ROOTS QEP begin?

ROOTS pilot groups start Fall 2021. The full implementation of ROOTS begins Fall 2022 for all students.

What is the ROOTS Action Plan?

- 1. Redesign onboarding experience.
 - a. Develop application procedures and a checklist for admissions staff to process new applications efficiently using a new platform (Recruit).
 - b. Use the flipped advising model to help students enter appropriate Guided Pathways communities, declare career path-ways, and complete degree plans as formal onboarding elements.
 - c. Use inventories to assess personal awareness of interests, aptitudes, and abilities to better associate students with their needs, co-curricular activities, and campus resources.
- 2. Craft an advisor milestone training rubric for student services staff to assist students.
- 3. Design and make accessible the ROOTS Canvas classroom to house onboarding, student resources, career readiness, and offboarding activities for all students.
